NEW NAME, SAME MISSION

The organization has officially changed its name to “The Arts Federation.”

After months of conversations and planning in 2021, the Tippecanoe Arts Federation laid the groundwork for a massive rebranding campaign that launched at the start of 2022.

TAF has served a population of over 525,000 people across its 14-county footprint for over twenty years. This change is reflective of our regional focus and commitment to inclusivity of all of the individuals and communities we serve. In addition to a new logo and website, TAF affirms our organization’s position as the leader for arts and culture in northcentral Indiana.

GRANTSMAKING




